JANUARY 2024 TUTORIAL SIG

Karen purchased some charging cables 2.1 A and a cube to plug in the wall 30 Watt. Because she purchased



them separately she was questioning whether they were compatible. Jim explained:

Standard charging (5W): This is the slowest option, typically taking several hours to fully charge a smartphone. Many older models and basic chargers fall under this category.

Fast-charging (10W-30W): This is the most common type of fast charging, often supported by midrange and flagship smartphones. It can typically get your phone to 50% in 30 minutes and fully charged within an hour or two.

Rapid-charging (40W+): This is the fastest charging option, found on some high-end flagship models. It can charge your phone to 100% in less than an hour, some even less than 30 minutes.

Ultrafast charging (100W+): A relatively new category of charging speeds, currently limited to a few specific models. These can charge your phone in under 20 minutes!

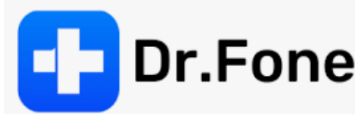
On December 29th, 2023, Louise B. accidentally deleted all her videos from her Samsung Galaxy S8 phone. She's not quite sure how it happened but she was in the Samsung file manager and tapped one video to delete and away they all went! She took her phone

to two Verizon stores and the Mr. Fixit store and everyone was in agreement; the videos are gone. No one attending could quite understand how she lost them. She uses Google Photos and

with Google Photos they back up to the cloud. Louise doesn't have a computer to check to see if her videos are backed up to the cloud but she did check the site at: <https://photos.google.com/> although she will go

to the library to use their computer to see if anything is there. She was also advised to try video restoring app Dr. Fone or File Recovery – Photo Recovery although after two weeks since deleted it's pretty unlikely to recover them.



There were many suggestions offered, but we needed to move on with the meeting. Don, Jim, and Brian agreed to stay after the SIG to work with Louise in recovering the files. *Side note: Because Louise posted her dilemma on Groups.io (Main@WAUC.Groups.io), she received additional advice from Bill James (located in Oklahoma) and Francis Chao (located in California).*

Make sure you are backing up your Google photos on your phone. For Android, go to SETTINGS, tap GOOGLE, then BACKUP. Tap BACK UP NOW. On

iPhone, OPEN your Google Photos app. SIGN IN TO YOUR GOOGLE ACCOUNT. At the top right, TAP YOUR PROFILE PICTURE OR INITIAL. TAP THE GOOGLE PHOTOS SETTINGS, then TAP ON BACKUP, TURN BACKUP ON.

If you are an Amazon Prime Member, Jim had a great tip for finding free books. On the Amazon website, type FREE KINDLE BOOKS in the search bar. Thousands of books are free to download to your device. If you favor a specific genre, instead type KINDLE BOOKS HISTORICAL FICTION, or KINDLE BOOKS CIVIL WAR, etc.

If the book price is \$0.00, that means the book is free. Once you have selected a book, click on the book cover. Verify the book is \$0.00. To download the book, click on the orange bar that reads, BUY NOW WITH 1-CLICK. A screen appears with the words, THANKS, YOUR

NAME! Below that you have the option to CONTINUE SHOPPING THE KINDLE STORE, VIEW A SUMMARY OF YOUR ORDER, or READ NOW IN KINDLE CLOUD READER. Below that it says, DELIVER TO YOUR KINDLE LIBRARY with a down



arrow. Click on DELIVER TO YOUR KINDLE LIBRARY. The book will now appear in your Kindle app. It's important to know, if you cancel your Amazon Prime membership, you lose access to any borrowed Prime Reading Titles, however you can keep Kindle books which you've purchased from your Amazon account. Any books that you "bought", even if they were free with your Prime membership, you keep in your Kindle library.

Richard would like the Kindle app for his computer as his Kindle Fire 8 died. To get the Kindle app for Windows, go to Amazon.com, in the search bar type KINDLE APP FOR PC, click on the first app that appears *****(Kindle app)**, click on the black bar for **DOWNLOAD FOR THE PC & MAC**.



We reviewed the Flightradar 24 app that Ron Brown presented at our January General Meeting and learned Flightradar24 is a global flight tracker that shows live air traffic from around the world.



Flightradar24 combines data from several data sources including [ADS-B](#), [MLAT](#), satellite, and radar data. This positional data is aggregated with schedule and flight status data from airlines and airports to create a unique flight tracking experience on www.flightradar24.com and in the [Flightradar24 app](#) available for iOS and Android.

We watched a short YouTube video, "How to Track Any Aircraft." To track a live flight, navigate to the airport of your interest and click either "Arrivals" or "Departures". Then scroll through the list and click your flight. From there you can check aircraft info, flight info, playback, and show the flight on map (if it's live).



We followed a small FedEx plane from Rhineland to Milwaukee, then a Frontier passenger flight from Denver to Milwaukee. Someone asked, "What do the different colored planes mean?" The blue planes on the map are tracked from a satellite and the yellow ones are tracked from the regular earth-based radar stations.

What is the difference between a password and passkey? Passwords are user-generated whereas passkeys

are automatically generated using public key cryptography. Unlike passwords, passkeys are a new type of digital credential that is phishing-resistant and can't be easily compromised.

Passkey	VS	Password
Automatically generated		User generated

Google Passkeys are a simple and secure alternative to passwords. With a passkey, you can sign in to your Google Account with your fingerprint, face scan, or device screen lock, like a PIN. They're very easy, secure, and convenient. To get your own Google Passkey takes less than a minute. On your Android phone, go to G.CO/PASSKEYS. Follow the prompt. On your PC, open the CHROME OR EDGE BROWSER, to G.CO/PASSKEYS, if you're not logged into Google, do that now. You will be asked for your Google password to verify your identity, and click on NEXT. On the next screen click on CREATE A PASSKEY. You choose if you want a fingerprint, facial recognition, or a PIN. Click on CONTINUE, it will be saved and you're all finished. It's that easy. If you use more than one Google account, do this for each account. You're now able to use your passkey to log into your Google accounts. If you have two factor authentication enabled, your passkey bypasses it because your passkey means you have physical possession of your phone.

Next Jim took us to the 2024 CES (Consumer Electronics Show) in Las Vegas to see some of the weirdest products in the show this year. We saw things like a transparent television, a smart grill, a face mask that serves as a privacy filter with a built-in microphone and sound dampening, a high-end virtual reality helmet, and televisions as art.

There was a problem with the Zoom invitation for this evening's meeting in that it wasn't sent out on Groups.io. Please make sure you have saved the invitation link somewhere so should something like this occur again, you will still be able to join the meeting.

Lisa just purchased a Google Pixel cell phone, switching from a Samsung. She is in the process of organizing her book-

marks and Don was giving her step-by-step instructions. He was advising her to go to the BOOK-

MARKS TOOLBAR which in Firefox is located by clicking on OTHER BOOKMARKS, found in the upper right corner of the Firefox browser screen, just below the menu bar. Right click on a blank area of the bookmarks toolbar and select ADD FOLDER. Give the folder a name for example, KNITTING and SAVE. Now, because her bookmarks toolbar was filled, Don right clicked on folders on the toolbar and edited their titles to give more room on the toolbar. To get the bookmarks in the designated folders just drag and drop the bookmarked website to the folder. Again, right click on an vacant spot on the BOOKMARKS TOOLBAR and scroll down to MANAGE BOOKMARKS. All your bookmarks and folders from the toolbar pop up. Now you are able to move your folders around in the preferred order. If you right click on a folder, select OPEN ALL BOOKMARKS, all the websites (bookmarks) will show at the very top of your screen and they will all try to open up. If you left click on a folder then all your bookmarks are listed. To close multiple tabs at one time right click on any of the tabs shown at the top of the screen and select CLOSE MULTIPLE TABS.

Lisa's husband likes to play a game called, "Cribbage Classic" but he is bombarded by ads. Is there a way to avoid ads in games? You came to the right place Lisa,

we know a few ways. Cribbage Classic has a number of settings that can help you to learn the best



move for your situation and offer assistance if it notices that you are making a sub-optimal play. It has a fast mode where all counting is done for you and you get to simply focus on discarding

and pegging. It is available in the Google Play Store, Apple App Store, and Microsoft Store.

Most often the best way to get rid of ads is to purchase the app; usually priced from approximately \$1-\$3. However, he has never seen anything offering the purchase option. When you have an app bugging you with ads, turn phone to airplane mode or turn Wi-Fi OFF.

Another game discussed was Solitaire. Many like to play the game but most have complained too about too many ads. I have played the same Solitaire game for years; no ads, ever. When you first boot the game up there is a screen telling you "power-ups" are for sale. I opt out and that's the end of it. The app offers three different Solitaire games; Duels, Classic, and Vegas. I always play Classic. It offers the option to replay a hand, which I never do. Every four hours (in real time) you are eligible to collect 200 credits to play with although I have never been short of credits and presently have almost 400,000. It's an easy, fun game and it tells you how long it's taken you to play each hand. Because



I've played it for so many years, I also enjoy playing to beat my fastest times. You are rewarded with 1 point for every card you put on an ace. If you win the hand you get a 100 point bonus. The name of this app is Solitaire and the maker is Super Lucky Casino. It's available for Microsoft, Android, iOS, and Kindle Fire.

The next question asked was, How do I add a shortcut to a website to my Home Screen on An-



droid? Open your Chrome browser. Go to the website or web page you want pinned on your home screen. Tap the kabob icon (3

dots in the upper right-hand corner) and tap ADD TO YOUR HOME SCREEN. Choose a name for the website shortcut, then Chrome will add it to your home screen.



Rita would like the Everything app. The Everything app is a powerful search engine designed specifically for Windows operating systems. It's an incredibly efficient tool that helps users locate files and folders instantly by filename. With minimal resource usage, Everything swiftly indexes files and folder in merely a second to index 120,000 files. It's rated 4.5 out of 5 stars and there is a free version. It can be downloaded from the Softonic website at: <https://everything.en.softonic.com/>.

Richard's voicemail on his Moto smartphone has suddenly changed from English to Spanish. Jim had heard of that once before and was able to solve the person's problem. He couldn't remember exactly what he did so he advised Richard to come to the upcoming library event offering free technical support.



At the library event, Jim was able to change Richard's voicemail from Spanish to English. After much searching, Jim found LANGUAGE in the voicemail settings. After listening to all the prompts he pressed a number on the keypad and was able to change it.

Many members have laptops but very few use the touchpad. Most are using a mouse. To encourage the use of the touchpad, we watched a short video, "How to use a Lenovo laptop's touchpad like a pro", by Cool IT Help. The video demonstrated important taps and gestures swipes, how to customize gestures,

JANUARY 2024 SMARTPHONE SIG

Don Skarda, Terry Harvey, JJ Johnson, Jim Hempel, Kathy Schnagl, Julia Rice, Rita Bruce, Lousie Dahms, Don Gardner, Karen Fenney, Louise Bozek, Margaret Cortez, Bill James, Brian Behling, Richard Durand, and Jan Mlagan were all in attendance.

Bill James got us started by putting in a plug for his upcoming presentation on the "Dark Web".

Rita asked about her text messages. Some go in SMS format while others go in MMS. She is wondering why. This led to a lot more questions.

I was on the phone with both of my daughters who wanted a copy of a recent picture I had on my phone. I sent it to both – the one with an Android phone got the text message and photo while the one with an iPhone got the text, but no photo. It is a mystery!

We never really answered these mysteries of texting. It could be affected by the cell service provider, signal strength, make and model of phone, Wi-Fi vs data and more.

SMS stands for Short Message Service. As the name implies, it is a protocol that is used to send



and receive short text messages.

The messages are sent and received over your mobile network, and you don't need a data plan for it to work. Your carrier may levy

charges separately for every SMS you send, though receiving SMS is usually free

MMS messages are delivered in a different way from SMS. The first step is for the sending device to encode the multimedia content in a fashion similar to sending a MIME message (MIME content formats are defined in the MMS Message Encapsulation specification). The message is then forwarded to the carrier's MMS store and forward server, known as the MMSC (Multimedia Messaging Service Centre). If the receiver is on a carrier different from the sender, then the MMSC acts as a relay, and forwards the message to the MMSC of the recipient's carrier using the Internet.



MMS does not use Wi-Fi in sending multimedia messages but instead it uses data and network service in sending MMS messages. As MMS isn't an instant messaging service, it requires an active SIM card, network service and an active data plan in sending MMS messages.

It's not an understatement that SMS and MMS have not been able to compete with modern-day IM apps.

There is a shift underway to convert to RCS. RCS is the evolution of SMS and MMS. It stands for Rich Communication Services, a communication protocol like SMS.

RCS differs from traditional SMS by vastly extending the character limit on each message. You can also add all types of media to your messages, letting you share images, videos, and GIFs. You can even send location data and create group chats. You can also receive read receipts, and your messages are also encrypted. This is made possible as RCS uses internet data to send content instead of the conventional telephony network. It is also expected to enable better communication between Android and iPhone. We also noted a discussion about prioritizing Wi-Fi over mobile data to save on your data plans.

The discussion shifted to the use of Passkeys. Terry has implemented this for her Google activities and Kathy has had a similar experience with Passkeys and Amazon.

The benefits of using passkeys are that it eliminates the risk of password leaks or phishing attacks, as no actual password is ever shared. There is no more remembering or resetting forgotten passwords. Just a quick tap or glance unlocks your accounts and signing in is quicker and smoother, especially on mobile devices. They are convenient and work across different devices and platforms, as long as they support passkeys.

Passkeys are still in their early stages, but major tech companies and organizations are backing them. As more websites and apps adopt them, the password-free future might be closer than you think!

After the previous presentation to WAUC members about passkeys, Terry described a simple way to create a passkey for Google.

Enter your PASSWORD

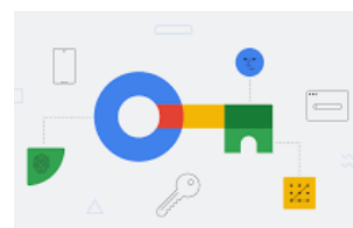
Enter your PIN

A popup box will appear titled PASSKEY SAVED

Click on OK

You did it!

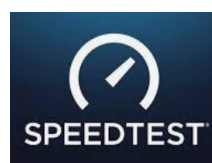

A number of short subjects came up. First was about a Kindle Fire 6 that Terry likes because of its light weight and size. She is looking into getting one. Jim mentioned that his five year old Note 10 is having battery issues; it has passed the Samsung update time and it has a cracked screen - it may be time for a replacement.

The next question dealt with internet speed. Is it easy to determine? Absolutely not! There are so many variables. To name a few, there is your internet provider, your modem and router, your own computer or smartphone plus whatever other devices are sharing the WI-FI signal. To get a true reading, you should make sure there are no other devices using your WI-FI. Is somebody streaming a television? Is anyone playing video games? How about security cameras? Weather stations? And so on. Disconnect those.

You need to restart your computer so there are no other applications running, no VPN, no back-



ground tasks. Then connect your PC to your router and open Speedtest.net. Hit the GO button and you should get as close of a true reading as possible.

Taking a more practical approach, I'm just inter-

ested in determining if I have a good signal with a respectable speed. I'm not interested in testing my speed against what my provider states as their maximum speed. I don't turn off other devices. I don't restart my computer and I use wireless. I do this the same way every time so the conditions remain consistent. When you run the SpeedTest you'll end up with something you can compare to previous test results. If you are interested in learning more about SpeedTest, here is a link to a short video on it.

Karen told us a story she got from a Spectrum rep at Costco. She was told that Spectrum uses different Verizon towers than Verizon does. We decided to research this and found out the actual cell service providers don't own towers. The biggest owner of towers is American Tower Corp. They own a lot of towers and lease out space to cell service providers to mount their equipment on top of the tower.

One of our very warm sunny winter days, I went for a long walk and returned home through a St Francis city park. Any guess what's in that park. A cell tower. And look who owns it. Now take a look up at the top of the tower. Do you see a cell antenna up there? Looks like more than one.



What's the takeaway from this Spectrum salesperson story? Be skeptical of salespeople stories in stores.

Staying with cell service, Rita uses Mint for an unlimited plan and we compared it to others. Mint seems to consistently get good ratings for their service. They have various options ranging from \$15 to \$50 per month. It compared favorably to other plans we discussed.

We closed the meeting with a discussion on printers. Terry expressed that she had printer issues with her HP printer. Here is a link to a video about the subject.
