YouMail app since changing carriers from Verizon to Spectrum Mobile. Spectrum Mobile uses Verizon towers so what is the problem? After checking the internet to see which carriers support YouMail, Spectrum was listed as a supported carrier. She contacted Spectrum Mobile Technical Support and was told they didn't really know anything about the app and advised her to contact Samsung. A call to Samsung also proved of no help. She emailed technical support at YouMail. They were very committed to help

and offered a number of suggestions. None of them worked. After 3 weeks of struggling with the app, 3 more calls to Spectrum, 10

emails between YouMail, and many hours of frustration, success! The problem was she had to have Spectrum change the IMEI. Whoever would have thought that the problem? Editor's note: A separate article regarding YouMail can be found in this issue.

Keep in mind, if you have Spectrum internet, Spectrum Mobile is offering free cell service for a year.

Jan asked about digital gift cards.

What are they and how do they
work? Almost all retailers offer consumers gift cards as a way to shop or



give money to friends and family. There are two types of gift cards—physical and digital (e-gift cards)—and each comes with a wide range of features and benefits.

Gift cards usually refer to a plastic card while digital gift cards have no physical form. instead, you're assigned a unique gift code number that you can use to redeem at online retailers when making purchases. Physical gift cards are the most popular type, in part because gift-card givers perceive them as being more like actual money or credit cards.

You can also store codes for digital gift cards inside a mo-

bile wallet app, such as Apple Pay or PayPal's Venmo. Then, when you're ready to check out, you can select your digital gift card as your preferred method of payment. All stores have to prevent gift cards from expiring for up to five years after their activation date. Watch for inactivity fees if left unused too long.

Karen could be in the market for a new phone and asked about the pur-

chase process. Richard had some similar questions. When purchasing a new phone, you have several options. This includes to buy it directly from a mobile carrier, purchase an unlocked phone online, buy from a retailer like an electronics store, use a phone payment plan through your carrier, trade-in your old phone for a discount, or opt for a refurbished phone to save money.


There are pros and cons to each of these. For example, buying a phone directly from your carrier used to be expensive due to hidden costs, but now prices are more transparent, and financing plans are often interest-free. The downside of buying from your carrier is that the phone will be locked to that carrier, limiting your options for switching to a different carrier. Be aware many carriers love including unnecessary apps on phones. While some manufacturers are also guilty of this, we don't need carriers pre-installing even more smartphone apps. Most of these are useless, and they often can't be uninstalled.

When you purchase a new phone, you probably want to move all your data to the new phone. This can vary by manufacturer. Here is a general way for Android users.

To move data from your old phone to a new phone, use your Google account to back up your

data on the old phone, then sign into the same Google account on your new phone during setup to restore the backup, allowing you to transfer contacts, photos, calendar events, and app data; depending on your phone manufacturer, there may also be a dedicated data transfer tool available to facilitate the process. iPhone users would follow similar steps using their backup in their cloud storage.

After this process is completed, check your new phone carefully to make sure all the items you selected to transfer have been copied over to the new phone. Doing this does not remove your own personal information from your old phone. Make sure you take the additional steps to reset your old phone to Factory Default. This is typically found in





Samsung has created a method for their 21.6 phones that makes this very easy. All you have to do is make sure your devices are close together and that you have a stable internet connection. Open the Smart

Switch app on your new device and tap Start, then follow the onscreen instructions. You will have the option to choose which data you wish to transfer.

SPEED TEST

INTERNET Somehow, we got onto the subject of the internet speed, both download and upload speeds. A simple way to do this is to open a browser

and type in speed test. This will result in a new screen coming up that lets you check the internet by clicking a button labeled Run Speed Test. In response, you will be given the number of megabits per second that can be downloaded and a second number for the upload speed.

Downloading is usually quite a bit faster. It is generally recommended to have at 25 Mbs in order to stream a movie without a lot of buffering. A wired connection is always faster and more reliable but often due to the location of various pieces of equipment, the wireless connection will be the preferred choice. It WILL be slower if you choose wireless.

Then we talked about all the Black Friday specials.

Typically, there are a lot of televisions, ear buds,



laptops, appliances and other hardware items. But also included in these specials, you are likely to find some streaming special prices.

Here are a few of these streaming specials I found for Black Friday 2024.

Hulu: \$1 per month for a year, or \$3 per month for a bundle with Disney+. Ad-supported plans only. You can also add Starz for an extra \$1 per month for a year.

Peacock: \$20 for a year, or \$2 per month for six months. You can also use the code REALDEAL to save on an ad-free annual plan, or REALDEALMONTHLY to save on an ad-free monthly plan.



Max: Six months for \$3 per month.

NFL Sunday Ticket: \$89 for the remaining season.

Paramount+: Two months ad-free with Showtime for \$3 per month. (For ad-supported plans, still gets you three months free)



Karen noted that Spectrum is now providing Paramount + in its package. Paramount+* is now included with Spectrum TV Select plans and Mi Plan Latino. You can now activate your Paramount+ subscription and dive in with over 40,000 episodes and movies, originals like Tulsa King and live sports, including the NFL on CBS and so much more! Browser apps was next on our list of topics. When it came to popularity, we found this graph:



The on-line marketplace has seen the rise in popularity of an app called Temu. It offers very low prices but has

longer lead times since its merchandise comes directly from China to the purchaser. In order to maintain its share of the consumer market, Amazon has introduced their app called Amazon Haul We also learned that for a limited time, Amazon is discounting all purchase by 50%. Delivery is more like two weeks instead of two days.

Terry asked about "hotspot" and how they are used. A hotspot is a location where people can access the internet wirelessly with a mobile device. Most hotspots work



by using cellular data to connect devices to the internet via Wi-Fi. Many modern smartphones come with built-in hotspot features that can be turned on easily in the "settings" menu. Also known as "phone tethering," setting up a cell phone hotspot enables you to share your phone's cellular data with other devices, such as laptops and tablets.

While using your cell phone as a mobile hotspot is generally simple, the exact steps you'll need to take can vary depending on the operating system it uses:



iOS: To set up a hotspot on an iOS device, go to the "cellular" section of the settings menu and switch the "personal hotspot" slider to on.

Then, tap the "allow others to join" slider if you'd like to allow other devices to connect.



Android: To set up a hotspot on an Android device, first go to the settings menu and hold down the "mobile hotspot" icon to turn it on.

Then, view the Wi-Fi options in your device's settings, and find your phone's hotspot name.

To utilize these features on your phone, you'll need to make sure your cellular data plan supports personal hotspots.


